Kala Patthar is the highest point of the tour at **5400 meters**. Here, we stop to admire the breathtaking close-up views of the Himalayas, including Mount Everest, which leaves everyone speechless.

We also visit the stunning Gokyo Lakes, the world's highest freshwater lake system. We land at the third Gokyo Lake, known for its serene beauty. After taking in the views, we fly back to Kathmandu, where our unforgettable [Everest helicopter tour](#) concludes.

Trip Itinerary

Day : Arrival in Nepal

Upon your arrival at the Tribhuvan International Airport, a representative from Naata Trek and Tours will be waiting for you at the airport, displaying a playing card imprinted with your name. He/she will then transfer you to the designated hotel. In the evening, we can enjoy a welcome dinner hosted by Naata Trek and Tours. Day : Kathmandu Sightseeing

After breakfast, we will have a pre-trip meeting, where you will be introduced to your Guide. During the meeting, you can provide yourself with any queries regarding the trip.

We visit Boudhanath Stupa, one of the most significant Buddhist shrines in the world, where we observe Buddhist monks praying in the monasteries surrounding the stupa.

After Boudhanath Stupa, we visit Pashupatinath Temple, the most famous Hindu temple in the country. It is located on the banks of the holy Bagmati River. Here, we see Hindu holy men (sadhus) meditating, pilgrims bathing, and occasionally, funeral pyres burning on the ghats.

We will also visit Bhaktapur Durbar Square, a collection of pagoda and shikhara-style temples grouped around a fifty-five-window palace of brick and wood. The attractions of the Bhaktapur Durbar Square are the Lion Gate, the Golden Gate, the Palace of Fifty-Five Windows, art galleries, and the Statue of King Bhupatindra Malla.

We leave for the airport early to start our heli tour. After about an hour, we reach the Everest Base camp; we do not land there but fly over the base camp with dramatic aerial views of the Everest region, which is an amazing experience. We land at Kala Pathar, get off for about 10-15 minutes, and soak in the spine-chilling beauty of the titanic, Mount Everest, and the neighboring mountains.

Our next stop is at one of the beautiful Gokyo Lakes. We spend a few minutes around the lakes, listening to the sound of silence and admiring its tranquility. Finally, we head back to Kathmandu, and in the evening, Naata Trek and Tours will host a THANK YOU farewell dinner program.

Note: If necessary, we may have to stop at Lukla to refuel the helicopter.

Additional Trip Information

Can I catch Acute Mountain Sickness during the EBC Helicopter Trip?

You might catch the Acute Mountain Sickness during your tour to Everest Base Camp. The helicopter tour to Everest Base Camp is a high-altitude tour where you will reach an altitude of around 5400 meters. There will be a higher chance of altitude sickness for anyone above **2500 meters**. It would help if you were adequately acclimated to the conditions so your body adapts to the higher altitudes.

Since this Everest Base Camp helicopter flight is a short trip of a few hours, you will land at Everest Base Camp and spend a few minutes, so the chances of catching altitude sickness are low. However, you still have the opportunity to suffer from Altitude sickness. It is a serious issue that might lead to death.

You should be aware of the conditions before you fly. Consult your doctor if you have any health-related issues before you fly. Carry emergency medications for altitude sickness. If you experience any symptoms during your visit to Mount Everest Base Camp, quickly try to descend to lower altitudes.

What is the weight limitation for Mount Everest Base Camp Helicopter Tour with landing facilities?

A high-performance helicopter can hover up to an altitude of **10,400 feet**. You will need a turbine-engine chopper, which can fly up to **25000 feet**. It can hold up to six people, including a pilot. Specific weight limits should be monitored before flying to higher altitudes. A helicopter that flies up to 4000 meters from sea level can only hold up to 500 kg.

This weight should be divided into five passengers and a pilot. Likewise, a helicopter that flies above 4000 meters can only hold up to **250 kg**. If more than three people fly above 4000 meters, you should land at Pheriche and manage your weight load before flying to Kala Patthar.

During the spring season, daytime temperatures are pleasantly mild, ranging from 10 to 15 degrees Celsius. *Additionally, the Rhododendrons are in full bloom during this time, creating vibrant and colorful forests.* This stunning scenery can be enjoyed by helicopter flying to Everest Base Camp.

Likewise, autumn offers conditions similar to those of spring. Autumn brings clear skies, providing exceptional aerial views of the Himalayas in the Everest region. The weather is perfect, with temperatures ranging from **10 to 20 degrees** Celsius. Additionally, this season is festive in Nepal, featuring festivals like Dashain, Tihar, Chhat, etc.

Summer and Winter are not the ideal season to take a helicopter flight to Everest Base Camp. The weather in the Himalayas is unpredictable. It changes in no time. So, it is risky as the skies get covered with clouds. Since it is a **30-minute flight**, the tour operators operate flights during the off-season, determining the weather conditions.

Do I need a Permit for the Everest Base Camp helicopter flight?

You will need a permit for the Everest Base Camp Heli Tour. The tour requires the Sagarmatha National Park Permit and the Pasang Lhamu Sherpa local area permit. A Sagarmatha National Park entry permit costs **NPR 3000** for foreigners and **NPR 1500** for visitors from SAARC nations.

Likewise, the Pasang Lhamu Sherpa Rural Municipality Entrance Permit costs NPR 2000. It is the same price for everyone. However, you do not need to manage all these permits alone. Your tour package will cover everything, and you will be handed over all the necessary permits before you fly.
