The drive goes from Kathmandu to Chitwan, then to Lumbini, and back to Kathmandu. It offers scenic landscapes.

You can admire the stunning views of Gauri Shankar (7,146m), Dorje Lakpa (6,975m), Langtang Lirung (7,246m), and Shisha Pangma (8,027m) from Bhaktapur.

Enjoy memorable activities at Chitwan National Park. These include an elephant-back safari, a canoe

ride, a jungle walk, and bird watching. There is also a Tharu dance, a village walk, and bathing with elephants. You will visit the Elephant Breeding Centre.

Enjoy a full day of sightseeing at the birthplace of Lord Buddha in Lumbini. You will explore its sacred sites and monasteries.

Further west in Pokhara is the majestic [Annapurna](#). Travelers can explore cultural landmarks there, like the World Peace Pagoda. They can also enjoy the tranquility of Phewa Lake.

Trip Itinerary

Day : Arrival in Kathmandu

On the day you arrive at Tribhuvan International Airport, Kathmandu, a Naata Trek and Tours representative will be there. They will be at the terminal holding a sign with your name. You will see 20 of the world's tallest mountains during the flight. They are to the east of Nepal. You will see Langtang Lirung. It is the closest mountain to Kathmandu. You will also see Mount Everest. It is the tallest mountain in the world. You can also enjoy

the sights of Cho-Oyu, Shisha Pangma, and Lhotse, among many others.

During the day, we go sightseeing at Kathmandu's UNESCO World Heritage sites. These include Kathmandu Durbar Square, Pashupatinath Temple, Boudhanath, and Swayambhunath. Kathmandu Durbar.

Day : Sightseeing of Patan and Bhaktapur

Today, we will go on a tour of two other UNESCO World Heritage sites in Kathmandu Valley. We visit Patan Durbar Square, the city of fine arts. The town retains its old charm. It has narrow streets. The streets have brick houses and artistic courtyards. It also has Hindu Temples. It also has Buddhist monasteries.

Similarly, you can find many temples in the medieval city of Bhaktapur. It also has stone-paved streets. It is home to Nepal's tallest temple, Nyatapola.

Day : Drive to Chitwan

We have breakfast. Then, we start a 5-hour drive to Sauraha, Chitwan National Park. The drive is scenic. It goes through hills, and the Trishuli River is by our side. After you check in at the Hotel and refresh yourself, our nature guide will brief you on our upcoming activities. We will take a guided jungle walk. We will also stroll around the Rapti River and enjoy the sunset. In the evening, there will be a cultural dance performance by the people of the Tharu tribe.

Day : Full-day jungle safari in Chitwan National Park

We are going on a jungle safari in Chitwan National Park today. It was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984. The park plays a vital role in saving endangered wildlife. The park is home to 68 mammals, 126 species of fish, and 544 species of birds. It also has several endangered animals, such as the Bengal tiger.

Day : Drive to Lumbini

We drive to Lumbini today, which takes roughly 4-5 hours. Buddhists worldwide know Lumbini as the birthplace of Buddha. They consider it one of the most important sites. During the day, we visit the numerous.

Day : Drive to Pokhara and sightseeing

We have our breakfast and drive a 6-hour drive to Pokhara. The city is a popular tourist hotspot, known for its views of the Himalayas and the number of Lakes.

Day : Pokhara sightseeing

Before dawn, go to Sarangkot Hill Station early in the morning to view the ever-popular sunrise view. The view of the sun's rays hitting the mountains is quite different. Later, we visited Bindabasini temple. We then returned to the hot Hotel, WeHotel, for breakfast. Afterward, we visited Hotel Davis Falls, Gupteswor Mahadev temple, and the mountain museum.

Day : Drive back to Kathmandu (200 km/ 8-9 hours)

We start our drive back to Kathmandu after having our breakfast. The drive back is scenic. For most of the trip, we'll see rolling mountains, small towns, and rivers. You can spend the evening strolling around Thamel. You can buy souvenirs to take home.

Day : Departure

We bid farewell today. Then, a Naata Trek and Tours rep will escort you to Tribhuvan International Airport for your flight home. Reflect on the majestic Himalayas. Kathmandu: Gateway to Nepal's Heritage

Kathmandu Durbar Square:

The temple complex is also home to many monkeys. They are considered holy and key to the temple's charm.

Pashupatinath Temple:

Pashupatinath Temple is a **UNESCO site**. It sits on the Bagmati River. Lord Shiva is the dedication of the sprawling complex. The temple complex is essential. It is vital for Hindu pilgrimage. It features cremation rituals along the riverbank. Many people believe that these rituals help. They help with liberation. In some areas, authorities restrict photos. Changunarayan

Patan (Lalitpur): Ancient City of Arts and Crafts
